About the Symbols

Do not touch the tip of the blade with your fingers.


Doing so may result in injury.





Do not insert your fingers between the T-slot table and the arm or between the heads and the Z-axis cover.

The fingers may be pinched, resulting in injury.





If operation continues even after you open the safety cover, wait until operation stops.

Doing so may result in injury.



Perform dry cutting with no cutting oil.

Such materials can cause fire.





Do not touch the tool immediately after cutting operating stops.

The tool may have become hot due to friction heat and may cause burns if touched.



Switch off the machine and unplug the power cord from the electrical outlet before performing cleaning or maintenance.

Failure to do so may result in injury or electrical shock.



Please use a vacuum cleaner to remove cutting dust.

Do not use any blower like airbrush. Otherwise, dust spread in the air may harm your health.







This document describes the installation, connections, spindle operation, and specifications when the safety cover is installed on the MDX-650/500.


For information about operation of the MDX-650/500, see the respective User's Manual.

NOTICE

Use within a temperature range of 5 to 40°C (41 to 104°F) and within a humidity range of 35 to 80%.

Do not place any object except tools or workpiece materials inside the safety cover. Doing so may not only obstruct operation, it may result in machine breakdown.

When you are installing the MDX-650/500 and the safety cover on a table with casters, securely engage the caster stoppers.


Do not place objects on the heads of the MDX-650/500 or on the safety cover.

To prevent accidents, do not install in any of the following types of areas.


- Avoid use in areas subject to strong electric noise.
- Avoid use in areas subject to high humidity or dust.
- The MDX-650/500 generates heat when used, and should not be installed in an area with poor heat radiation characteristics.
- Do not install in an area subject to strong vibration.



4 Spindle Action

NOTICE

Do not open the safety cover, during cutting. Opening the cover during cutting results in an emergency stop. Any cutting data in use becomes invalid, and cutting cannot be continued.

While the safety cover is open, the spindle does not turn. At this time, it is also not possible to make the spindle turn using the control keys.

When sending operating instructions from the host computer or when rotating the spindle with the control keys, close the safety cover.

5 Use and Handling of the Cover


Opening and Closing the ZBX-650 Door

ACAUTION




When opening or closing the safety cover, grasp the handle with both hands


The fingers may be pinched, resulting in injury.



When opening the ZBX-650 door, grasp the handles with both hands lift the door up out of the groove, then pull the door back toward you.



When closing the door, after lowering the door to the closed position, lift it slightly and press inward to fit the edge of the door into the groove.



Removing the Cover for Maintenance

ACAUTION




Switch off the machine and unplug the power cord from the electrical outlet before performing cleaning or maintenance.

Failure to do so may result in injury or electrical shock.

When opening the base cover of the MDX-650/500 to clean out cutting waste, you must detach the front part of the safety cover in advance. Remove the four screws shown in the figure.

After maintenance has finished, attach the front part of the safety cover at its original position, then tighten the four screws securely.



*Do not remove anything other than the four screws shown in the figure.
